Operations:

- Service and maintain fleet vehicles and equipment to a high standard.
- Perform diagnostics to identify and resolve mechanical issues.
- Undertake light engineering tasks including building, repairing and modifying machinery through electrical repairs, welding and general fabrication.
- Replace and repair key machinery components such as gear boxes, clutches and exhaust systems.
- Conduct road tests to verify repairs and operational performance.
- Complete accurate and detailed job sheets and maintenance records.
- Support with collection and delivery of vehicles to the workshop.
- Liaise with drivers, supervisors and managers on day-to-day mechanical issues and provide solutions.
- Proactively continue to learn, upskill and share knowledge to support the ongoing development of yourself and others.
- All other duties as reasonably requested.
